Spay/Neuter Clinic

Is your pet Spayed or Neutered? Spaying and neutering your pet will improve your pet's health by preventing or decreasing the chances of some reproductive diseases and cancers. It may also help reduce marking, aggressive tendencies or running away to find a mate.

Our clinic offers quality spay/neuter services at **reduced rates**.

Our low-cost spay/neuter program is open to anyone in need. We welcome pet owners as well as community cat care takers to participate in our clinic.

State Program

If you are receiving approved state public assistance programs, you may qualify for the state subsidized spay/neuter program which includes a rabies vaccination for just \$20 per pet.

Once approved, you will receive a voucher and may choose a provider including our shelter's clinic which accepts state spay/neuter certificates.

TNR (Trap-Neuter-Return) for Community Cats

Trap-Neuter-Return is the humane and effective approach for stray and feral cats. Cats are humanely trapped and taken to a veterinarian to be neutered and vaccinated. After recovery, the cats are returned to their home—their colony—outdoors. TNR stops the breeding cycle of cats and therefore improves their lives while preventing reproduction.

We accept walk-ins to spay/neuter trapped community (feral) cats on

Mondays: Drop off 8:30 am – 9:00 pm

Pick up 4:30 pm – 5 pm

All community (feral) cats **must be in humane traps and covered by a sheet** to reduce stress while they are in our care. Pick-ups are same day. If trapping more than 3 cats, please call and coordinate with clinic.

Spay/Neuter Prices

Cat Services

All cats must arrive in individual hardtop carriers (no cardboard or cloth carriers) and all community (feral) cats must be in humane traps.

Prices:	Services:
\$60	Cat Spay (female)
\$45	Cat Neuter (male)
\$15	Rabies Vaccine – please bring current proof of rabies
\$15	Distemper Vaccine
\$10 -11	Flea Treatment (one-month topical)
\$14	Revolution – treats fleas, some worms and ear mites. Recommended for community cats (one-month topical)
\$8	Dewormer
\$11 - 13	Profender – treats all worms, including tapeworms
\$20	Microchip
\$25	FIV/Leukemia Test
\$7	Capstar (kills live fleas only)

We do not declaw cats as this is actually the amputation of your cat's fingers. It contributes to behavior problems, leaves your cat with no defenses and is considered inhumane.

Physical evaluation and pre-operative blood work is required for small to large dogs over 7 years old, giant breed dogs over 4 years old, and cats over 10 years old.

There may be a difficult surgery fee.

This may include, but is not limited to, females in heat or pregnant, obesity, abnormal anatomy, or difficult to handle.
